Careers Programme

General Information

At Winchmore School we aim to support and equip students with the knowledge, skills and understanding to make appropriate choices for their future career pathways. We aim to ensure that our Careers programme is both planned and progressive and that from Year 7 students are supported and encouraged to build individual skills and knowledge. We aim to encourage pupils to make good choices and understand what they need to do to reach their goals.

The Careers Programme aims to contribute to the development of pupils as individuals through:-

- increasing their awareness of their present and future choices
- providing each student with individual, impartial careers advice
- providing opportunities for students to discuss choices with outside providers
- enhancing students skills in dealing with transitions
- enabling students access to Higher Education
- developing students employability
- improving students key skills
- contributing to raising students achievement and motivation
- providing information to enable parents and carers to support students when making pathway choices

Key Stage Support

Students need to make informed decisions at various key stages whilst at Winchmore School and also understand the relevance of their choices and how these can impact on their futures. It is also important that parents and carers have access to information and guidance to help support our students with these next step decisions.

The role of the Economic Wellbeing Coordinator and the Careers Adviser is to work with students, parents and carers, and staff to ensure that all our students form a realistic and positive view of their capabilities and that they are prepared to meet the challenges they will face.

One to One Careers Guidance

The Careers Adviser is based in school each week on Tuesday and Wednesday.

All Year 11 students will all have a one to one appointment with the Careers Adviser scheduled between September and May. Students will be notified in advance of the appointment and students are expected to attend the appointment on time. Parents and carers are also welcome to attend these appointments.

Year 9 students are offered the option of a Careers Appointment in February and March and a letter will be sent to parents advising of this should they wish to discuss careers choices prior to the Year 9 Options Evening.

All Year 12 students on a one year Foundation Pathway will also be offered appointments throughout the academic year and again parents and carers are welcome to attend these appointments should they wish.

All Year 12 and Year 13 students also have the option of an appointment with the Careers Adviser and these appointments should be booked by the students with the staff in the Economic Wellbeing Office.

Provider Access

Representatives from Universities, colleges, sixth form colleges, apprenticeship providers and employers are invited into school to participate in a number of school events to make sure that our students are making the right choices for their future pathways.

Work Experience

We offer each student a range of opportunities to understand the developments in the world of work and work experience is an important part of our programme.

At Winchmore School students have two opportunities to experience a work placement as part of their school timetable

Year 10 students have work experience for one week at the end of April/beginning of May.

Students are encouraged to find their own placements but we do also have support from the London Borough of Enfield to secure placements.

Year 12 students have work experience for one week in July. We encourage students to find an appropriate placement that will support their future career choices and which will prove useful for both UCAS and apprenticeship applications.

Learning Support

The Careers team work to support the programmes and careers activities and ,offer targeted careers information and guidance ,for all students who are supported by our Learning Support Faculty

Support for Sixth Form Students

There is a comprehensive team of staff at Winchmore School dedicated to supporting our sixth form students with their choices Post 18.

There are many opportunities in Key Stage 5 for the students to develop their interest in a subject by attending workshops, taster courses, lectures and by obtaining relevant work experience. Support is also offered with UCAS applications and students who wish to follow an apprenticeship pathway are also offered help with this choice. Students can access the school's Careers Adviser for further impartial advice and assistance in one to one sessions.
